

Around the World Storytime

Description

Participants will participate in an interactive storytime and then do a related activity or craft.

NOTE: This activity is designed to give libraries a number of options so they can customize their program. There are several books and various crafts/activities to choose from.

Book options:

- If You Were a City by Kyo Maclear and Sanna Francesca
- In the Woods: An Adventure for Your Senses by Mariona Tolosa Sisteré
- **Snap!** by Anna Walker

Suggested interactive song/rhyme options:

- The Wheels on the Bus (If You Were a City)
- Going on a Bear Hunt (In the Woods)
- Five Little Speckled Frogs (Snap!)

Craft/activity options:

Crafts

- Beginner origami jumping frog (Snap!)
- Mapping activity (If You Were a City)
- Nature stationery (In the Woods)
- Transportation sensory bag
- Sensory bin
 - Create a sensory bin with objects related to the theme of the story.
 - Include tactile books if possible.

Space considerations

An indoor space where participants can be seated to do an activity.

Materials

Reading the story

- A book to read (can order the other two for families to look at)
 - o If You Were a City by Kyo Maclear and Sanna Francesca
 - In the Woods: An Adventure for Your Senses by Mariona Tolosa Sisteré
 - Snap! by Anna Walker
- Multiple copies of the book for participants to follow along
- Microphone (recommended)

Activity/craft

Activities

- Beginner origami jumping frog (Snap!)
- Mapping activity (If You Were a City)
- Nature stationery (In the Woods)

Sensory activities

- Transportation sensory bag
- Sensory bin objects

If You Were a City

- o Building blocks, Duplo, Lego or any other building material
- Toy cars
- Toy buildings or other replicas of neighbourhood features

In the Woods

- Fallen pieces of nature (don't pull living things from nature)
- Plastic nature replicas
- o Small things you might bring on a hike

Snap!

- Small items that make noise (e.g., shakers, Velcro strips)
- Any toy or plastic animals, insects or fallen/replicated pieces of nature, preferably but not limited to:
 - Reptiles: frog, alligator/crocodile
 - Birds: duck, goose, owl
 - Insects: bees, dragonflies
 - Nature elements: tree bark, plant leaves, flowers, pebbles/rocks

Preparation

• Prepare for a standard storytime with 10–15 minutes allotted for the picture books and 15–20 minutes for the activity/craft.

Making the story interactive

• Look through the title and write descriptions of the spreads beforehand, while generating questions for the audience.

Suggested questions

| a) Shapes: What shapes do you see? |

Activity/craft

Choose activity/activities and prepare accordingly.

- Print passive activity sheets.
- Prepare sensory bins.
- Set up craft station.

Implementation

2. If you find they are not really participating, start asking silly questions or make up an inaccurate storyline to get them to correct you (e.g., "Is the story happening underneath the bed or in the washroom?" "I'm guessing this story is about a sneezing zebra...").

Activity/craft

- 1. Distribute activity sheets.
- 2. Distribute materials.

Accessibility considerations

Reading the story

- Use a microphone (optional).
- Use a loud voice and speak slowly.
- If possible, place hold on multiple copies of the selected book(s) so participants who need it can flip through the book along with you.

Activity/craft

- Offer multiple types of writing tools.
- Offer tactile materials for decorating.
- Offer large glue sticks (if needed).
- Have tactile books on hand.




Neighbourhood mapping activity

Transportation Sensory Bag

Let's add some 3D wheels to these vehicles from around the world.

- 1. Colour in the images
